THE BOOK SHOPPE

Charmian Kittridge, a woman ahead of her time. Not known as a beauty, but described as captivating, educated, smart, intellectual, talented in the arts, practical in business, athletic, tough, energetic, adventurous, independent—all adjectives (except maybe "practical in business") that could also be applied to Jack London, the most successful author of that period. Their paths crossed in 1900, and the rest is history. Only, history was generous to Jack, but forgetful of Charmian, who eventually and inevitably assumed her place as his second wife and life "mate." She was the woman behind the man, even helping to write some of his books. Marlo Faulkner, a renowned scholar of all things Jack London, will be here on Monday, October 27, 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. in the West Room, to tell us the fascinating story of how all this came about. Jack London and his best friend George Sterling were instrumental in establishing the artist colony in Carmel-bythe- Sea, luring many "bohemians" from San Francisco after the earthquake of 1906.
