Our October author, Marlo Faulkner, taught high school English, history, and film for 33 years before becoming a journalist who for the next 13 years wrote a column in the *San Mateo Times* about textiles and fibers. Next, Marlo took an assignment that lasted 28 years covering The Shakespeare Festival; she eventually became a critic for the Festival. On assignment to the Sonoma home Charmian Kittredge London built as her own home and as a museum after her husband Jack died, Marlo was so intrigued that she spent the next decade and more immersed in research, much of it at the Huntington Library, to become a recognized "Scholar" of Jack London; then, she wrote a book based on Charmian's journals about the remarkable life and adventures she shared with Jack as his second wife.
